

# Meet Malala: The Girl Who Stood Up for Education



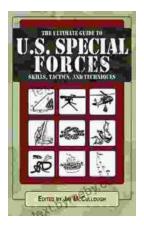
