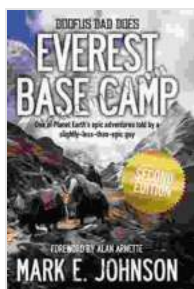


One of Planet Earth's Epic Adventures Told by a Slightly Less Than Epic Guy

But of course, I couldn't go on an adventure without getting into some trouble. One day, I was walking through a market when I got pickpocketed.

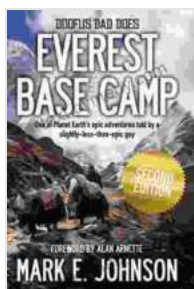
My wallet and passport were gone.
