


# Wilma Rudolph: Little People, BIG Dreams



## From Humble Beginnings

Wilma Rudolph was born in 1940 in Clarksville, Tennessee, the 20th of 22 children. Her family was poor and she contracted polio at the age of four. Doctors told her she would never walk again, but Wilma was determined to prove them wrong.






